
Registration considerations:

Each semester you will register for courses in your program and make progress towards completing your degree. There are a few items to consider before you create your schedule:

- ❖ Remaining courses to graduation (reference your Degree Audit to view progress in program)
 - Weigh how many courses remain versus what's manageable
- ❖ Personal responsibilities (you can expect about 6-9 hours work per week for a 3-credit course)
- ❖ F1 visa requirements (consult with OGS for questions and concerns regarding I-20)
- ❖ Study habits (reflect on how you manage your time and schedule your course work)

Your Curriculum

Your degree program is comprised of specific curriculum requirements: writing requirements, foundation courses, required major coursework, general electives, and NUpath. These requirements will total at least 120 semester hours.



Writing Courses: Three writing courses with corresponding online labs designed to enhance and elevate your writing skills

Foundation Courses: Courses designed to provide you with the skills and knowledge you need to excel in your major courses

Major Courses: The unique courses you are required to successfully complete to graduate with your specific major

NUpath Courses: NUpath is Northeastern's core curriculum for all Bachelor's degree students. It is comprised of 13 competencies (classes with specific themes or attributes) that all students must successfully complete. Most NUpath requirements are covered by required classes in your curriculum, but some are not. Reach out to your Academic and Career Advisor to discuss what NUpath requirements you still need to complete.

General Electives: The remaining courses you may need to successfully complete in order to earn 120 credits

Your degree audit is a detailed list of NUpath requirements, your specific major requirements, and your earned credits (including transfer credit). It details completed courses, transfer credits, and your remaining program requirements. You can access your degree audit by logging into your myNortheastern account.
